- About 15,000 personnel
- Over 65 readiness centers based in nearly 50 Georgia counties
- The sixth largest of the 54 National Guard states and territories

National Guard (430k)

- 2nd Largest Component of the DoD
- Army and Air Force
- 40% of the Army Operational Force
- 30% of the Air Force Operational Forces
- A dual-mission force serving both the state and the federal government
- Commanded by the State Governor unless federalized by the President
- Features a wide range of units, including combat arms such as infantry, armor, and artillery



Reserves (350k)

- Army, Air Force, Navy & Marines. (Coast Guard)
- 20% of the Army Operational Force
- 17% of the Air Force Operational Forces
- Serves just the federal government
- Commanded by the President
- Primarily consists of combat support and combat service support units (e.g., logistics, medical)

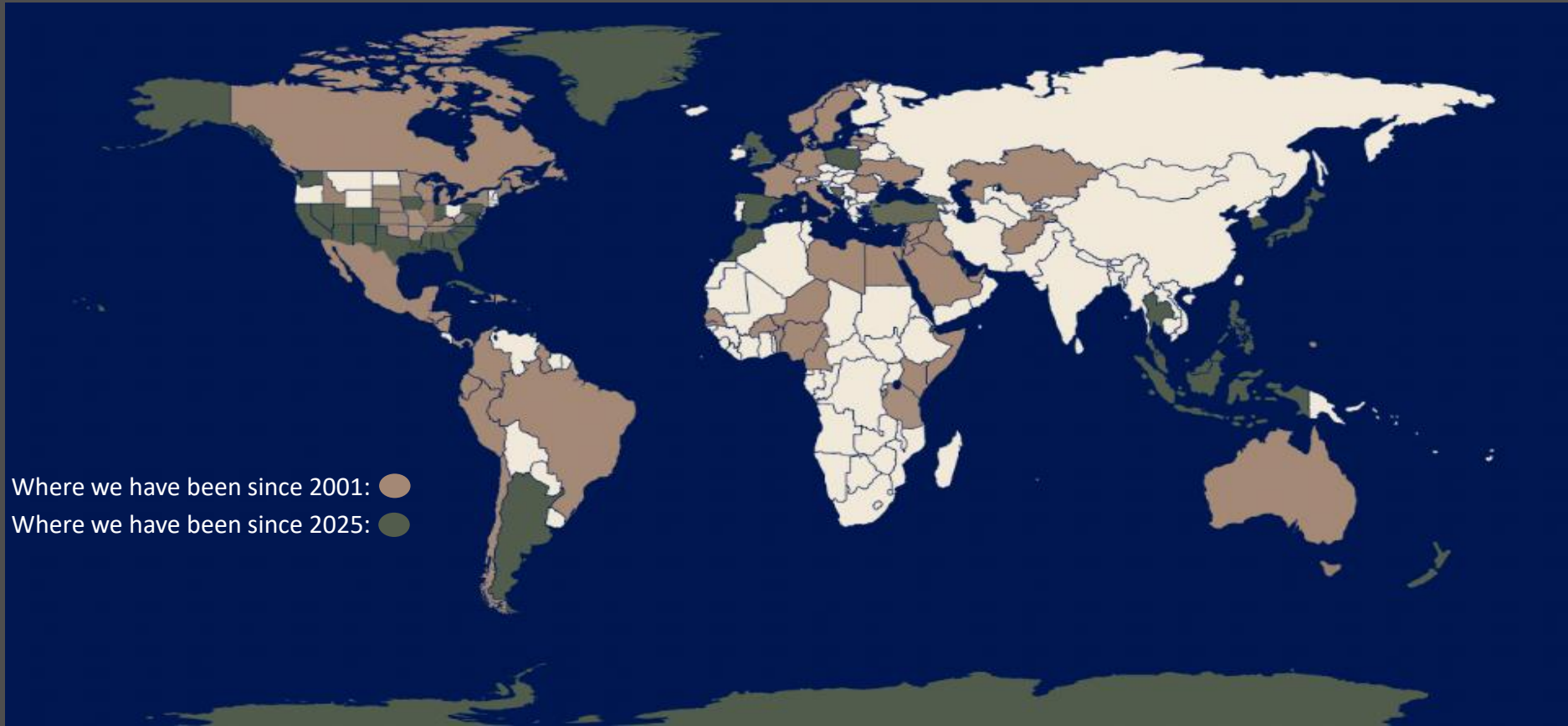

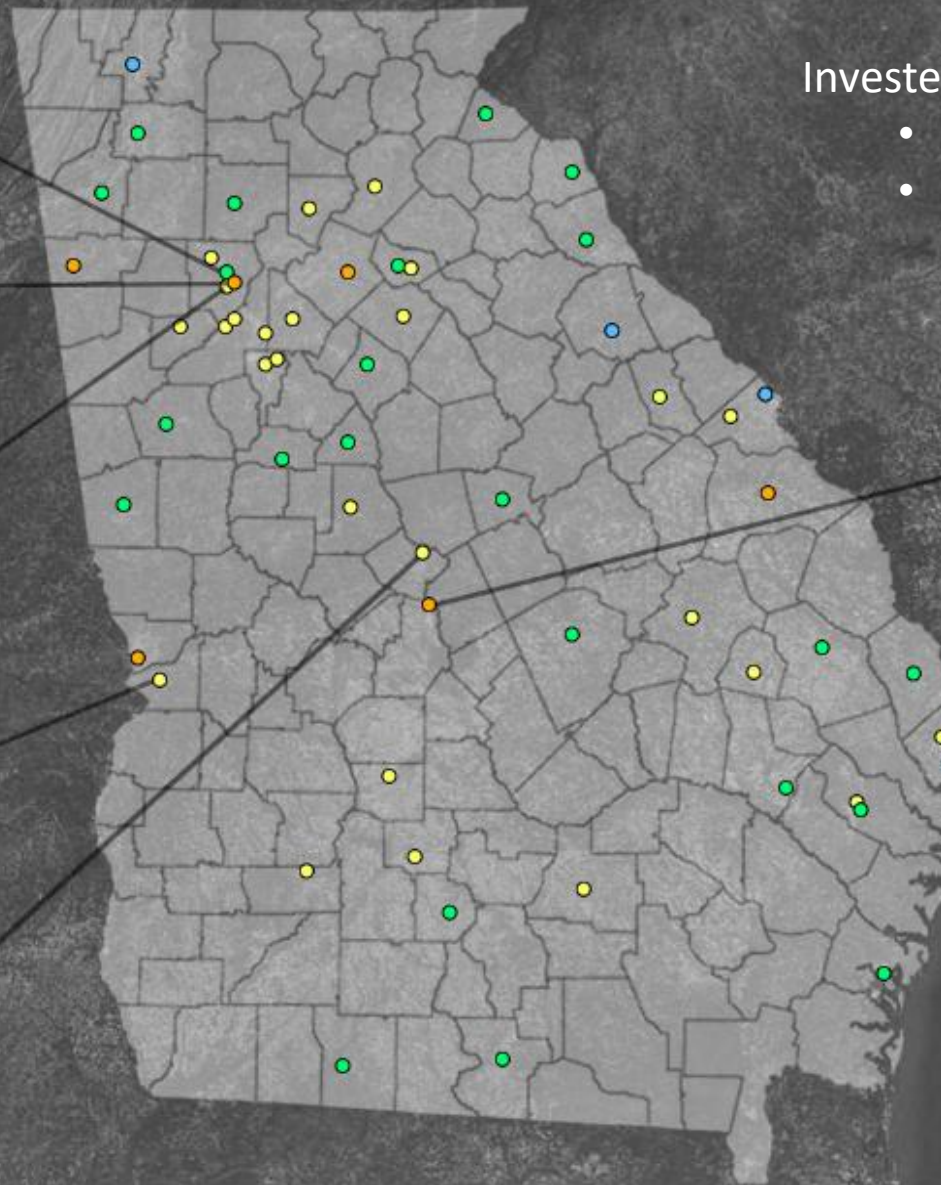

Mission:

The Georgia Army National Guard provides combat-ready forces to conduct large-scale combat operations, defend the homeland, and respond rapidly in support of civil authorities and the citizens of Georgia.

- Fifth largest Army National Guard in the nation
- Comprised of combat, combat support and combat service support units
- The Ga. ARNG is organized into five major subordinate commands
 - 48th Infantry Brigade Combat Team
 - 78th Aviation Troop Command
 - 201st Regional Support Group
 - 648th Maneuver Enhancement Brigade
 - 78th Troop Command





Georgia National Guard

48th Infantry Brigade Combat Team

- Headquartered in Macon
- 4,200 Guardsmen
- Designed to conduct combat operations worldwide by disrupting or destroying enemy military forces and controlling land areas as required
- Units:
 - 1st Squadron, 108th Cavalry Regiment
 - 1st, 2nd, and 3rd Battalion, 121st Infantry Regiment
 - 1st Battalion, 118th Field Artillery Regiment
 - 177th Brigade Engineer Battalion
 - 148th Brigade Support Battalion



Georgia Army National Guard

78th Aviation Troop Command

- Headquartered in Marietta at CNGC
- 600 aircrew members, maintainers and support staff
- Two subordinate battalions
- Black Hawk, Chinook and Lakota helicopters, fixed-wing and unmanned aircraft systems that provide command and control, air movement, air assault and medical evacuation support





201st RSG-HRF

- Headquartered in Marietta at CNGC
- 1,200 Guardsmen
- Three subordinate battalions
- Region IV Homeland Response Force designed to respond to emergencies in the eight states From Florida to North Carolina and west to Mississippi

648th MEB

- Headquartered in Columbus at Ft Benning
- 1,800 Guardsmen
- Three subordinate battalions
- A mission-tailored force which conducts support area operations, maneuver support operations, consequence management and stability operations to ensure the mobility, protection, and freedom of action to the supported force

78th Troop Command

- Headquartered in Marietta at CNGC
- 1,900 Guardsmen
- Four subordinate battalions
- Most diverse mission set and organization in the Georgia National Guard. It is home to the Georgia National Guard's largest battalion, the 110th CSSB, and its smallest, most specialized detachments





Mission:

Provide ready military forces to both federal combatant commanders and the Governor of Georgia, supporting national defense and state emergency response..

- Comprised of nearly 3,000 Citizen Airmen organized into two wings and geographically separated units across the state. Headquartered at Clay National Guard Center, Marietta, Georgia.
- The Ga. ANG includes:
 - 116th Air Control Wing
 - 165th Airlift Wing
 - Air Dominance Center

Modernization:

- Transitioned from the
- E-8C JSTARS mission after more than two decades of operations
- New multi-million-dollar Battle Management Combined Operations Complex is under construction to serve as a hub for future warfighting capabilities



About 1,500 Airmen located at Robins Air Force Base. Their mission is focused on Remotely Piloted Aircraft Integration (RPA-I), Advanced Battle Management, Command & Control, & Cyber warfare.

Combat Readiness Training Center

1 of 4 Combat Readiness Training Centers

Training Environment:

- Premier training destination for 4th and 5th-generation fighter aircraft
- Access to 50,000 square miles of airspace over the Atlantic Ocean

Capabilities:

- Complete aircraft sustainment and support facilities
- Lodging for up to 800 personnel
- Hosts major exercises like Sentry South and William Tell
- Serves as a platform for emergency response operations

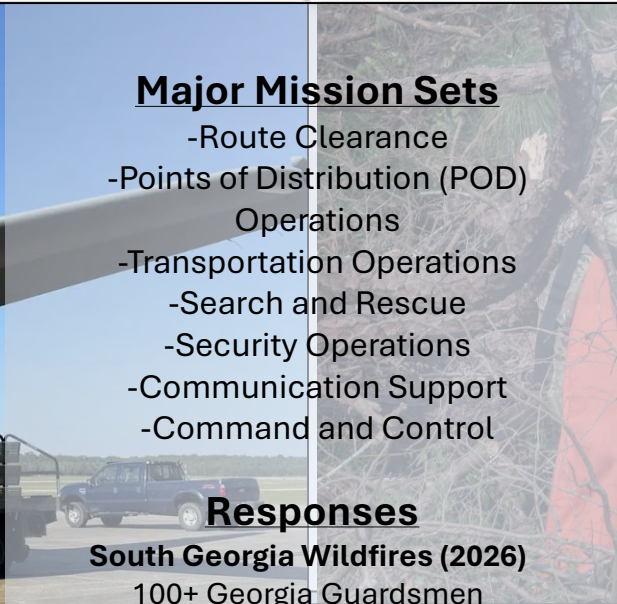
State Partnership Program

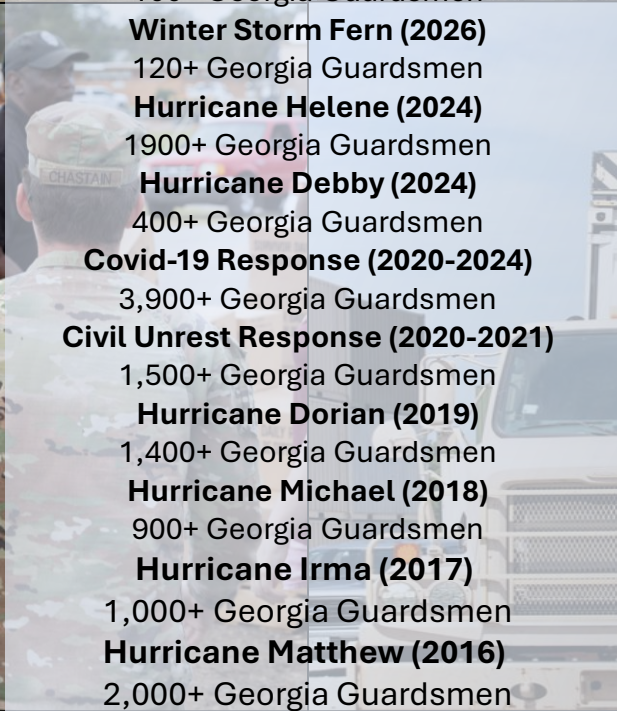

A Civil Support Team is a specialized unit trained to respond to **chemical, biological, radiological, nuclear, and explosive (CBRNE)** threats or incidents in support of civil authorities.

Key Functions of a CST:

- **Identify hazardous substances** (chemical, biological, or radiological)
- **Assess current and projected consequences** of the threat
- **Advise civilian responders** on appropriate response measures
- **Assist with requests for additional military support** if needed



Georgia National Guard

Counter Drug Task Force

- Specially trained Citizen Soldiers and Airmen that help reduce the supply and demand for illegal drugs by supporting law enforcement agencies
- In FY25, all seizures totaled **\$322 million** equaling \$904,000 per day for a program with a total annual cost of less than \$4.5 million per year
- In FY25, the Ga. CDTF supported seizures of **82.6M lethal doses of fentanyl** (this could kill the population of Georgia 7 times over and is up from 7.62 million in FY24)
- The Drug Demand Reduction Outreach program provides education to Georgia's youth about the dangers of drug use





Youth ChalleNGe Academy (YCA)

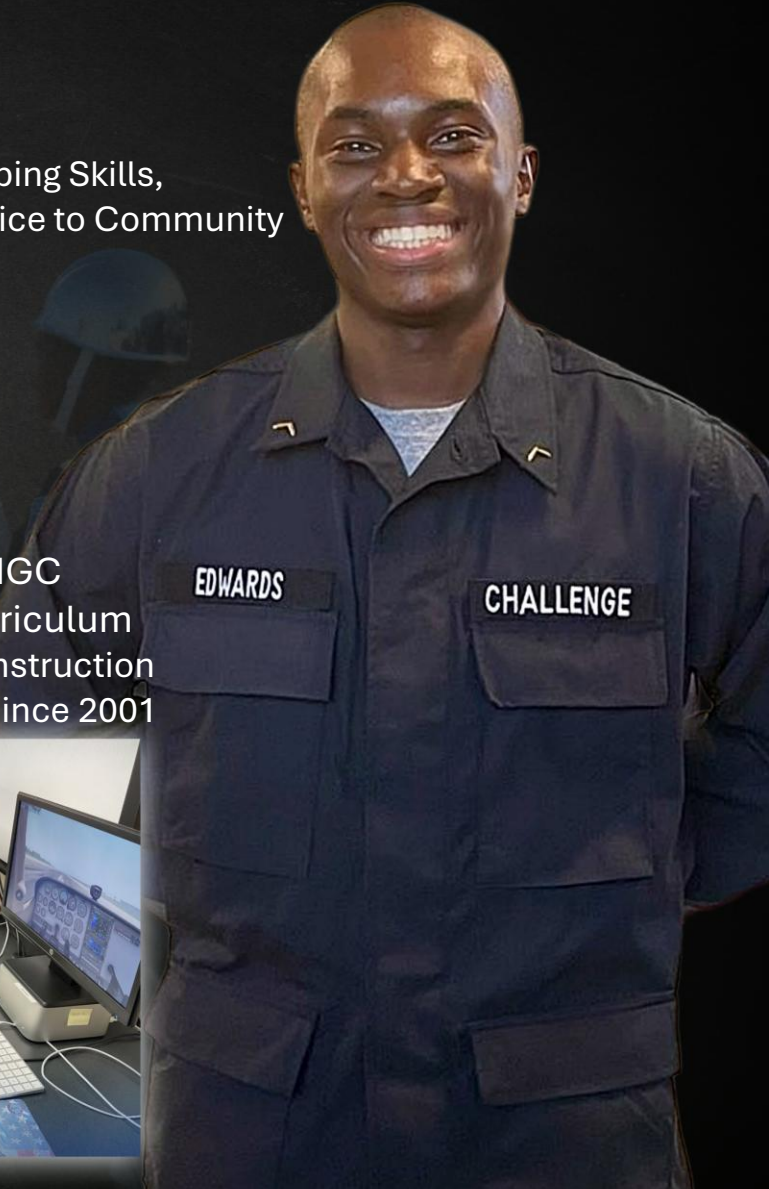
- Ft. Gordon and Ft. Stewart Campuses
- 16–18 year-old at risk youth
- 22-week residential military-like environment
- Academic Excellence in pursuit of a HS diploma or GED, Life Coping Skills, Job Skills, Physical Fitness, Responsible Citizenship, and Service to Community
- Over 20,000 students graduated since 1993

- Ft. Stewart Campus
- Post YCA graduates
- Five-month residential program
- Certificate and Vocational Training
