



BRIGADIER GENERAL JASON W. FRYMAN

Commanding General, Georgia Army National Guard



Brigadier General Jason W. Fryman was appointed by Governor Kemp as the 17th Assistant Adjutant General – Army and assumed command of the Georgia Army National Guard on 3 May 2024. Concurrently, he serves as the Deputy Commanding General - Mobilization, Army National Guard, Fort Stewart, Georgia.

A native of Atlanta, Georgia, Brigadier General Fryman commissioned as an Aviation Branch Second Lieutenant upon graduation from North Georgia College in 1996.

His civilian education includes a bachelor's degree in criminal justice, a master's degree in organizational leadership, and a master's degree in strategic studies. His military education includes the Aviation Officer Basic Course - Initial Entry Rotary Wing Course (Honor Graduate), Aviation Captain's Career Course, Combined Arms and Services Staff School, the Command and General Staff College, and the Senior Service College at the U.S. Army War College (Resident). His aviation specialty schools include the Aviation Maintenance Manager's Course, the UH-60 Maintenance Test Pilot Course, the UH-60 Instructor Pilot Course, and the Rotary Wing Instrument Flight Examiners Course.



Brigadier General Fryman has held numerous command and staff positions. Most recently, he served as the Chief of Staff for the Georgia Army National Guard. Prior to this he served as the Senior Guard Advisor and Chief of Staff for the Future Vertical Lift Cross Functional Team, U.S. Army Futures Command in Redstone Arsenal, AL.

Brigadier General Fryman last commanded the 78th Aviation Troop Command, while concurrently serving as the Deputy Chief of Staff – Aviation & Safety for the Georgia Army National Guard. He previously served as National Chair for the State Army Aviation Officer's Executive Council and currently serves on the Aviation Readiness Advisory Council for the Director, Army National Guard.

Brigadier General Fryman's combat experiences include Operation Iraqi Freedom (2003-2005) and Operation New Dawn [Iraq] (2010-2011).

His awards and decorations include the Legion of Merit, Bronze Star Medal, Meritorious Service Medal (6th award), Air Medal, Army Commendation Medal, Army Achievement Medal (2nd award), National Defense Service Medal, Iraq Campaign Medal (w/ 2 service stars), the Global War on Terrorism Expeditionary and Service Medals, Armed Forces Service Medal, the Meritorious Unit Citation, Army Superior Unit Award, Parachutist Badge, Combat Action Badge, and Master Army Aviator Badge.

Brigadier General Fryman is married and blessed with two children.
