What does DDRO stand for?

DDRO stands for Drug Demand Reduction Outreach. It's a detachment of the Georgia National Guard's Counterdrug Task Force, dedicated to educating and empowering youth, parents, and communities to make positive free choices through prevention and outreach efforts.

Who Does DDRO serve and what is the cost?

DDRO serves youth, parents, college students, and community members through educational presentations and outreach events across the State of Georgia. All DDRO services are **completely free of charge**.

What topics are covered in DDRO presentations?

Our presentations cover a variety of prevention-related topics such as: effects of substance misuse, healthy coping skills, the impact of peer pressure, medicine safety, and Narcan education.

Are there any other programs that you have to offer?

DDRO incorporates educational and evidence-based prevention curriculums designed to engage students and support healthy development. These include: **DEA'S Operation Prevention**- Teaches students how drugs affect the brain and body through interactive lessons and videos.

GPS for Success- Focuses on goal setting, personal responsibility and positive decision making.

D.A.R.E. (Drug Abuse Resistance Education)- Offering soon, Proven prevention and life skills education.
