MEMORANDUM FOR ALL MEMBERS OF THE GEORGIA NATIONAL GUARD

SUBJECT: The Adjutant General's Policy for Exceeding 39 Training Days

1. References.

a. National Guard Regulation 350-1, Army National Guard Training, dated 23 June 2021.

b. Air National Guard Instruction 36-2001, Management of Training and Operational Support Within the Air National Guard, dated 30 April 2019.

2. This policy is applicable to all members of the Georgia Army and Georgia Air National Guard. The intent of this policy is to stabilize unit training schedules, which will make duty more predictable and increase participation in scheduled training events.

3. Each component will establish and publish a methodology for planning future training events by fiscal year at least 6 months before the FY begins. Each component will disseminate those training schedules down to individual Airmen, Soldiers, and their families.

4. Each component will annually identify and report all units that are scheduled to exceed 15x days of Annual Training and 48x MUTAs of unit-based training activities. This report will identify the reason for exceeding 39x training days.

5. The authority to change approved unit training schedules within 180x days of execution may not be delegated below the component commander. Component commanders are directed to report any changes they authorize within this window.
